Jan 29<sup>th</sup> 1933

Dear Mother.

I have had many attempts to get this letter written. I usually write Friday evening, but that was the day of the Feast at the end of Ramadan & had been paying visits all day. I had to go alone with just Sardic & the men as Little Un hates going to see natives. I started 8.30 & did not finish the round until<sup>sic</sup> after tea time & then I was so dead tired I just had my bath & supper looked over Amices<sup>sic</sup> correspondence to see if anything needed an immediate answer & then went to bed.

I intended then to write to you after lunch in the temple, but two German Professor friends of D<sup>r</sup> Gardiner's came

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& I had to devote my after lunch half hour to showing them the Osirion & getting the men to use the mirrors to reflect sunlight into the underground chamber. when I had finished work at tea time I had to drive into Bahama to meet the 6 o'clock train as the architect from Tel el Amarna was coming to make a plan of the temple & bringing a friend with him for two days visit. that evening I had to play hostess, & today at lunch time go down into the Osirion <sup>again</sup> to show it to the friend. now I am just snatching a moment at bath time. If I do miss a mail while Amice is away dont bother, because I have so much to do attending to her correspondence, accounts. looking after guests etc that I hardly have a moment to myself.
