

Arabah el Madfunah  
April 27<sup>th</sup> 1936.

Dear Mother & Father.

It was very sad to hear about Lizzie's death, I am afraid it will upset Sallie very much she was so devoted to her.

We are expecting D<sup>r</sup> Junker tomorrow to collate the rest of the work it will probably take him three days, when that is done we have all the packing to do, then we are ready to start our return to Cairo, I had such a nice letter from Hanafey Bey, he has been along the coast track to Suez & says it is in quite good condition & he very much hopes to see us in Hurghada again. It may be a bit hot crossing the Eastern Desert but we know the way so well that we can arrange our journey so as to shelter from the heat of the day when we can get under an overhanging rock & do our driving in the evening & early morning, when we get to the sea we shall be all right as they say it is quite pleasant in May as the sea has not had time to get

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hot & there is always a refreshing breeze.

Amice & I had a great treat to-day, the Command  
of the Camel Patrol at Sohag sent three of the  
best riding camels of the Camel Corps & he  
came over & had tea with us & took us for a  
ride in the desert, we did enjoy it, the camels  
had a lovely motion, their trot was like a  
horses gallop & the saddles beautifully comfortable,  
very different to the camels & saddles we have  
been used to, they were beautifully trained,  
he told us the noises to make to get them  
to start, trot, go faster & stop & they obeyed  
us very well though I am sure they must have  
thought the sounds we made were rather  
strange they were a mixture of hisses  
grunts & gurgles, not at all easy to make convincingly  
Your letter with the piece of stuff from Miss Collins  
has arrived, it has given us great amusement  
please thank her very much for it I was  
kind of her to get it for me, I shall make a  
little shirt blouse out of it. we are going to ask

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Dr Junker if he can read the hieroglyphics on it,  
I expect he will think it a great joke.  
I am so glad you saw the wedding, I expect  
Pat will have lots to tell you on her next visit.  
I cannot send you any further particulars of  
our plans for returning over Europe until we  
get to Cairo when we shall go to the Egyptian  
branch of the A.A. & get advice as to route etc,  
I shall leave my address with Cooks<sup>sic</sup> Cairo for  
forwarding letters & as soon as possible will  
let you know our route
