

Arabah.
April 23. 1931.

Dear Mother -

I have got the snaps I took at the festival at Beni Hamel & considering the difficulty I had taking them from the back of my camel & having to guess the distance I think they are very good. you will see the camel's head in several of them

Amice is getting very fed up with the Customs, yesterday she had to pay 5/- on a parcel from her Steppie, when opened it contained a box of chocolate, a pound of Foxis glacial mints & 3 6^d packets of Roundtree Gums. The latter were a sticky pulp. she had to give them to Abdullah. the chocolates were all squidgey & any way she doesn't like them. The mints were in good condition

The Customs had counted in the postage as part of the value & then charged at a rate of 50%. Rather spoils the fun doesn't it.

We are trying to get the work here finished by May 4th. Then we would have to pack up here &

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drive to Cairo, taking possibly 4 days, I am hoping to get a passage on the Japanese boat leaving P. Said May 11th if I cannot secure accomodation^{sic} on this boat the next is a Bibby leaving 17th also a British India & Blue Funnel.

We shall be staying in D^r Junker's camp at the Pyramids, he has left Egypt himself but has given his servants instructions to open the house for us there, Amice is going to finish a small job she was doing for him two years ago, so I shall stay with her until my boat sails, we can easily run into Cairo in Joey or by tram from Mena House & it will be much nicer than staying in Cairo.

It is getting pretty hot here now, we are mostly in a state of drip, I am looking forward to coming home again.
