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Luxor 95
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Dear Mother.

This is just a hasty note to let you know where I am, I am afraid I have had to miss a mail; but there was no opportunity of writing before.

We left Cairo by train, & spent the night with friends of Amice's in Assiout, Joey arrived the next morning, so we continued our journey in him as far as Sohag. roads too awful for anything all along canal banks steep slopes on either side & in parts so broken away that there was barely width on the ^{top} level for Joey's wheels.

At Sohag we were hospitably received by Mr & Mrs Oulton & the following day drove the last lap of our way to Bahiana, we arrived after dark & so tired that we just had some supper & went straight to bed. The next day we were hard at work unpacking cases & checking stores. we had just the one day in camp before coming on here.

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We are now in the famous headquarters of 95²
 the Eastern branch of the University of Chicago
 & they are very kindly showing us all their methods
 & processes. Everything here is very formal & polite
 & we are feeling a little overwhelmed, however
 we were able to relax our good behaviour this
 afternoon for we went to tea with Mr & Mrs N de G. Davis
 & they are both dears & quite old friends.

Mr Lucas is coming to dinner here tonight but
 I am afraid he is off too retiring a nature to
 unbend in this atmosphere. However it will be
 nice to see him again.

Hope to write you a longer letter
 when we get back to camp.
