

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

Dendera. Temple of Hathor. Propylon. Inner face.

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


Temple of Hathor, plan, P&M, p. 44

Biographical information: **Juan Victor Abargues de Sosten**, was born in 1845. In the decade of 1870 he lived in Egypt, married to a young Cretan woman. Working as an “architect for the Khedive” according to his own words. In these years, he was commissioned by the Spanish Court to collect Upper Egyptian animals for a Royal Garden in Madrid. Later, he also sold his collection of Egyptian antiquities to the Museo Arqueologico Nacional, Madrid , in two parts, 1877 and 1879. In 1881-1882 he leaded the Spanish Expedition to the Red Sea that explored regions of Abyssinia with a geographical as well as a commercial purpose. The travel is related in *Notas del viaje por Etiopia, Xoa, Zebul, Uolo, Galas, Madrid , 1883*. In 1884, after one ear in Europe, he returned to Egypt, where his family was left during his absence. No information about him for more than twenty years is known, except that he published in Cairo some novels placed in Medieval Islamic al-Andalus, written in French. He died around 1920, back in Spain. I wish to thank, Miguel Angel Molinero Polo for the above biographical information. RDK

In the north transept of Westminster Abbey is an over life-size statue, by Sir Francis Chantrey, in memory of Sir John Malcolm (1769-1833), soldier and statesman. It shows him in uniform with his left hand on a sword. The inscription reads:

Photograph, “Copyright : Dean and Chapter of Westminster”.



"In memory of Major General Sir John Malcolm, G. C. B. & c. Born at Burnfoot of Esk, Dumfriesshire, MDCCCLXIX, Died in London MDCCCXXXIII. Employed confidentially in those important wars and negotiations which established British supremacy in India by the indefatigable and well-directed exertion of those extraordinary mental and physical powers with which Providence had endowed him, he became alike distinguished as a statesman, a warrior, and a man of letters. Disinterested, liberal and hospitable, warm in his affections and frank in his manners, the admirer and patron of merit, no less zealous, during the whole of his arduous and eventful career, for the welfare of the natives of the east than for the service of his own country, his memory is cherished by grateful millions, his fame lives in the history of nations. This statue has been erected by his friends whom he acquired by his splendid talents, eminent public services and private virtues."

: c'est à peine si, avant de commencer mes démarches, je pris le temps d'aller visiter le magnifique temple de Denderah, où je mesurai l'inclinaison de l'aiguille.

Le temple de Denderah, construit en grès, est un des monuments les mieux conservés de l'Égypte ; Cléopâtre et Ptolémée Césarion, son fils, le commencèrent, et il fut continué par tous les empereurs jusqu'à Adrien et Antonin le Pieux. Il est malheureusement enterré dans les décombres formés de huttes qui avaient été construites sur le temple par les Arabes : la porte qui le précède, et qui se reliait au mur d'enceinte sacrée, est rattachée, par deux murs modernes, au portique. Les vingt-quatre colonnes, en partie enterrées, de ce magnifique portique sont couvertes, ainsi que les murs qui les entourent, de sculptures peintes représentant des souverains faisant des offrandes aux divinités : la voûte est ornée du fameux zodiaque rectangulaire. Sur les quatre faces des chapiteaux sont des têtes d'Isis au gracieux sourire et aux oreilles de vache, qui étaient pour les Égyptiens la représentation de la Vénus animale; ces têtes, qui, toutes, ont été martelées probablement par les chré-

tiens lors de l'établissement du christianisme, ou par les musulmans, briseurs d'images, portent de petits temples qui supportent les soffites et les plafonds dans lesquels sont sculptés des éperviers déployant leurs ailes et portant des harpéées (haches d'arme des Pharaons), et où l'on retrouve des femmes nues et allongées, qui, chez les anciens Égyptiens, étaient l'emblème de la voûte céleste. La façade du temple est tournée vers l'est; sur la corniche on lit une inscription grecque dont voici le sens : « Pour la conservation de l'empereur Tibère César, fils du dieu Auguste, les habitants de la métropole et du nome élevèrent ce temple à Aphrodite, déesse très-grande, et aux dieux adorés dans le même temple, l'an 21 de Tibère César, au mois d'Athyr. »

Après ce vaste portique, on entre dans une salle décorée de six colonnes à tête d'Isis et de sculptures peintes; cette salle communique dans les chambres et sanctuaires sacrés, et par une rampe assez douce, à des chambres à mi-étage, dans lesquelles était le zodiaque circulaire, aujourd'hui à la bibliothèque royale de Paris; on arrive, en montant, à une belle terrasse couverte de cahutes abandonnées et dans l'angle nord-ouest de laquelle s'élève un petit temple dédié à Vénus. Les prêtres pouvaient seuls sacrifier dans ce sanctuaire mystérieux, que l'on

ne peut voir de l'extérieur de l'édifice ; sur les faces latérales et postérieures du temple, on voit des sculptures d'offrandes et huit demi-lions sculptés en saillie; derrière, on trouve encore, dans les décombres, un petit temple dédié à Vénus Athor; au sud, une porte qui se reliait à l'enceinte, et en avant, sur le côté nord, le typhonium de Strabon qu'on distingue à peine dans les décombres. C'était dans ces typhoniums que devaient accoucher les reines; leurs enfants, demi-dieux, ne devaient voir le jour que dans l'enceinte sacrée du temple.

**From Egyptian Archaeology
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Two enigmatic graffiti

In the late nineteenth century a hitherto little known Spanish architect left two *graffiti* at Abydos and Dendera. **Miguel Á Molinero-Polo** places them in their historical and cultural contexts.

The *graffiti* that Juan Víctor (personal names) Abargues de Sostén y García (family names) incised in two Egyptian temples have caused some perplexity among those who have documented them. The identity of the writer of the one from Dendera has been simply described as 'unknown', and, as the nearby walls to the one at Abydos are covered with modern texts in Greek, it has been assumed that the *graffito*-writer was also Greek. It is not surprising that his Spanish identity remained unknown, since well into the twentieth century Spanish travellers or researchers were scarce in the Nile Valley. However, Abarques' life and activities provide an interesting glimpse into relations between Spain and Egypt during the European colonial period.

During the first half of the nineteenth century, when the foundations of academic Egyptology were being established in Europe, Spain had isolated itself culturally. This was the result of, and reaction to, the Napoleonic wars, the independence of the American colonies and the rejection of liberal ideas from the continent. The university curricula established in Spain around 1850 are one of the first signs of an intellectual revival which increased in the second half of the nineteenth century, and which included the first signs of interest in the ancient history of the Near East and Egypt. Spanish interest in what is now identified as 'Orientalism' was on a smaller scale than elsewhere and, due to its imitative nature, developed later.

Most of the earliest Spanish travelers to the Near East and Egypt were in transit to or from the Pacific colonies – they wrote accounts of their visits or acquired small collections of antiquities. Later, the Spanish government charted the first expedition of antiquarians to the Near East, with the frigate *Arapiles*, in 1871, and, in that same decade, grants were awarded to scholars, such as the

architect A Amador de los Rios who helped the Marquis de Rochemonteix in his work at the temple of Edfu. At the same time, Egyptian history books were written, to be used as manuals for college classes. In the following decade, Eduardo Toda, the vice-consul in Cairo, created the largest private collection of Egyptian antiquities to be sent to Spain; he was advised by Egyptologists of the Service des Antiquités, with whom he had close friendship. This also explains his supervision of the removal of Sennedjem's funerary equipment when this tomb was discovered – the first Spanish archaeological activity on Egyptian soil. However, the crisis provoked in the 1890s by the independence of the last colonies of the former Spanish Empire ended the hope of developing Egyptology as an academia subject in Spain. In 1899, a state project for the creation of chairs of Oriental languages, including ancient Egyptian, was annulled. Funding provided by V Galarza for the excavation of a tomb at Giza was the swan-song of these four decades.

Abargues was born in Algeria and spent his childhood there, arriving in 1872 in Egypt where he lived until 1916. It is not known under what conditions he was hired as an architect by the Egyptian government but he was only twenty-two years old, so this must have been one of his first jobs. The two *graffiti* are not far from his place of residence, Girga, which must also have been




The graffiti at Dendera. Photograph: Miguel A Molinero-Polo

the centre of his professional activities, though their exact nature is still unknown. In a document dated 1913 he refers to his recent responsibilities in creating cotton fields, but this does not mean that this has been his work four decades earlier.

Each *graffito* has several dates under his name testifying to regular visits to the temples. Of particular interest is the coincidence of years with two trips by Abargues to Spain in 1877 and 1879, in economic times which were so critical that the Egyptian government was unable to pay wages to its employees. On each trip he sold a small collection of antiques to the National Archaeological Museum in Madrid. They amount to more than 200 small objects (amulets, scarabs, bronze statuettes, etc.) and 100 coins. The inventory for each sale details their origins: mainly Abydos, Luxor, Dendera and Edfu. The identification of Abarques as the writer of the two *graffiti* means that doubts that have been expressed over the authenticity of some objects might need to be revised.

In 1877 he also donated 24 squeezes to the Royal Academy of Fine Arts in Madrid. Today they are lost, but plaster casts were made and thirteen different ones have already been found in several collections of art reproductions with a didactic aim; they reproduce scenes and details of reliefs from the temple of Abydos, except for




Typical small objects sold by Abargues to the Museum in Madrid.

a Graeco-Roman female head. The careful planning and execution of the *graffiti*, the coincidence in their location with the provenance of the collections he sold, and the requirement of a certain time to take the squeezes, could be clues which should encourage an investigation on his activities as architect.

Another as yet poorly understood aspect of Abarques' life is his interaction with the Spanish government while he was an Egyptian public servant. In 1876 he was responsible for acquiring animals in Upper Egypt for a 'Garden of Beasts' in Madrid, commissioned by the Court. During the two trips to Spain already mentioned, he was received in major cultural institutions and lectured in some of them - he gave the first documented speech on ancient Egyptian religion in the country. He also attended geographical congresses and debated subjects such as Spain's interest in participating in the colonist movement in Africa. All this intense activity paid off. He had written several reports to the Spanish government recommending the conquest of a port on the Red Sea; the purpose would be twofold, to market manufactured products into the region and to facilitate maritime transit via the Suez Canal to the Philippines. In 1881, Abarques received finance from a private association for an expedition to Abyssinia, which lasted for over a year, with military equipment granted by the Spanish king. He obtained some interesting topographical results and until recently, this was, in fact, the only well documented episode of his life.

The last known record of Abarques is a 'private report' sent to the Spanish king after a journey on horseback in 'Moorish dress' through the north of Morocco in 1899. He recommended that the region should be taken over by Spain in order to grow cotton. The motivation for the conquest a few years later would, obviously, have been more complex than a suggestion in a letter of Abarques - Spain had only recently lost its American colonies - but it meant that the Maghreb became the main target of Spanish Orientalism and Egypt was relegated to a second place. Until the UNESCO Nubian salvage campaign was initiated in 1960 there was to be no further Spanish archaeological activity in the Nile Valley.
