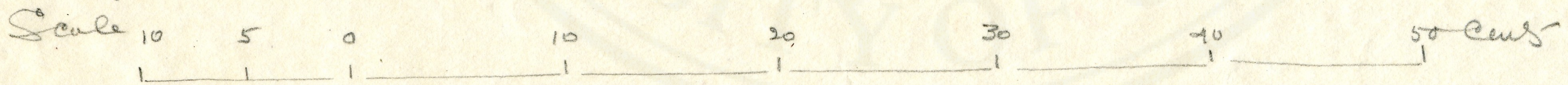
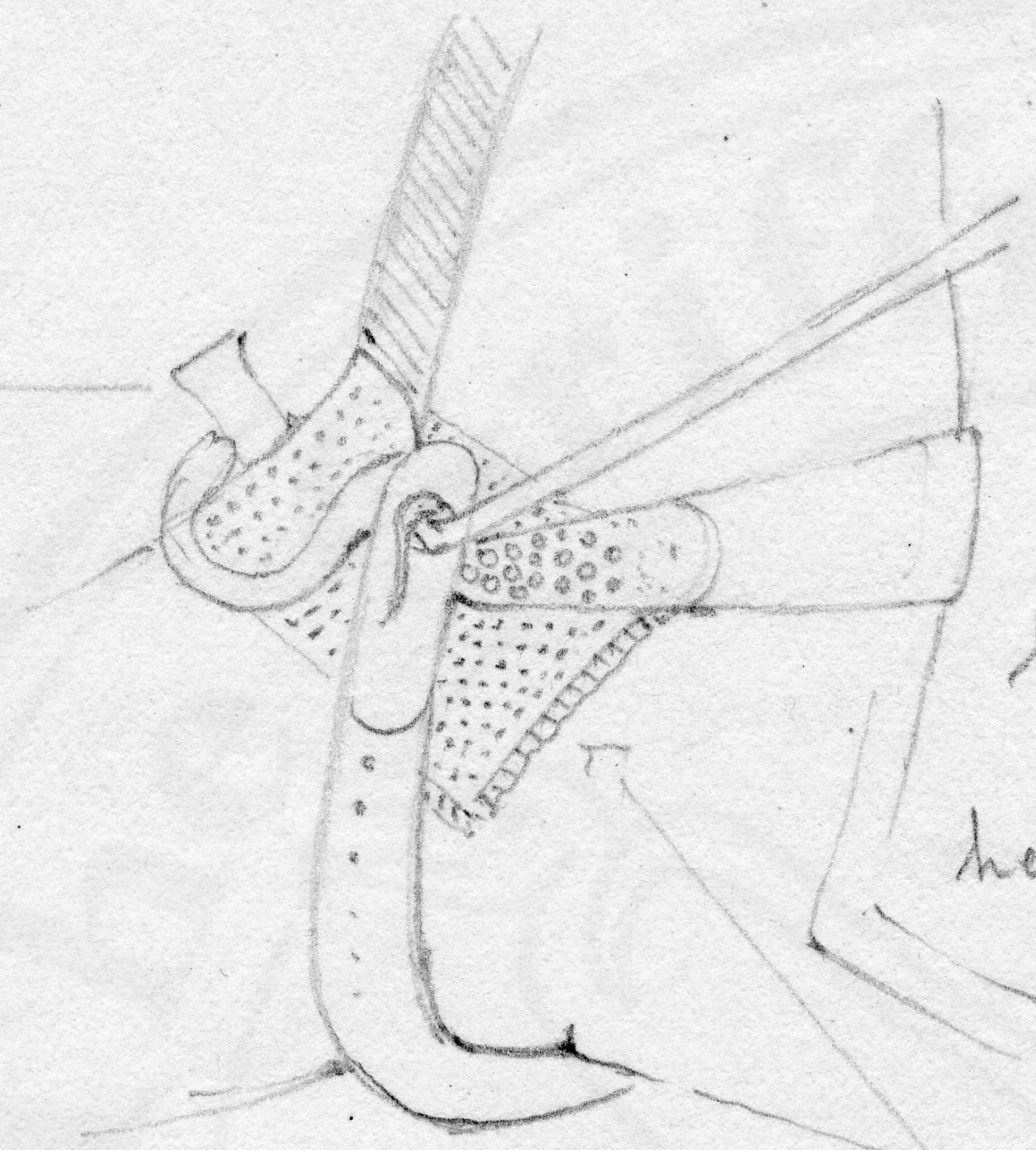


Yoke bound to pole and saddle bound to yoke with leather thongs.



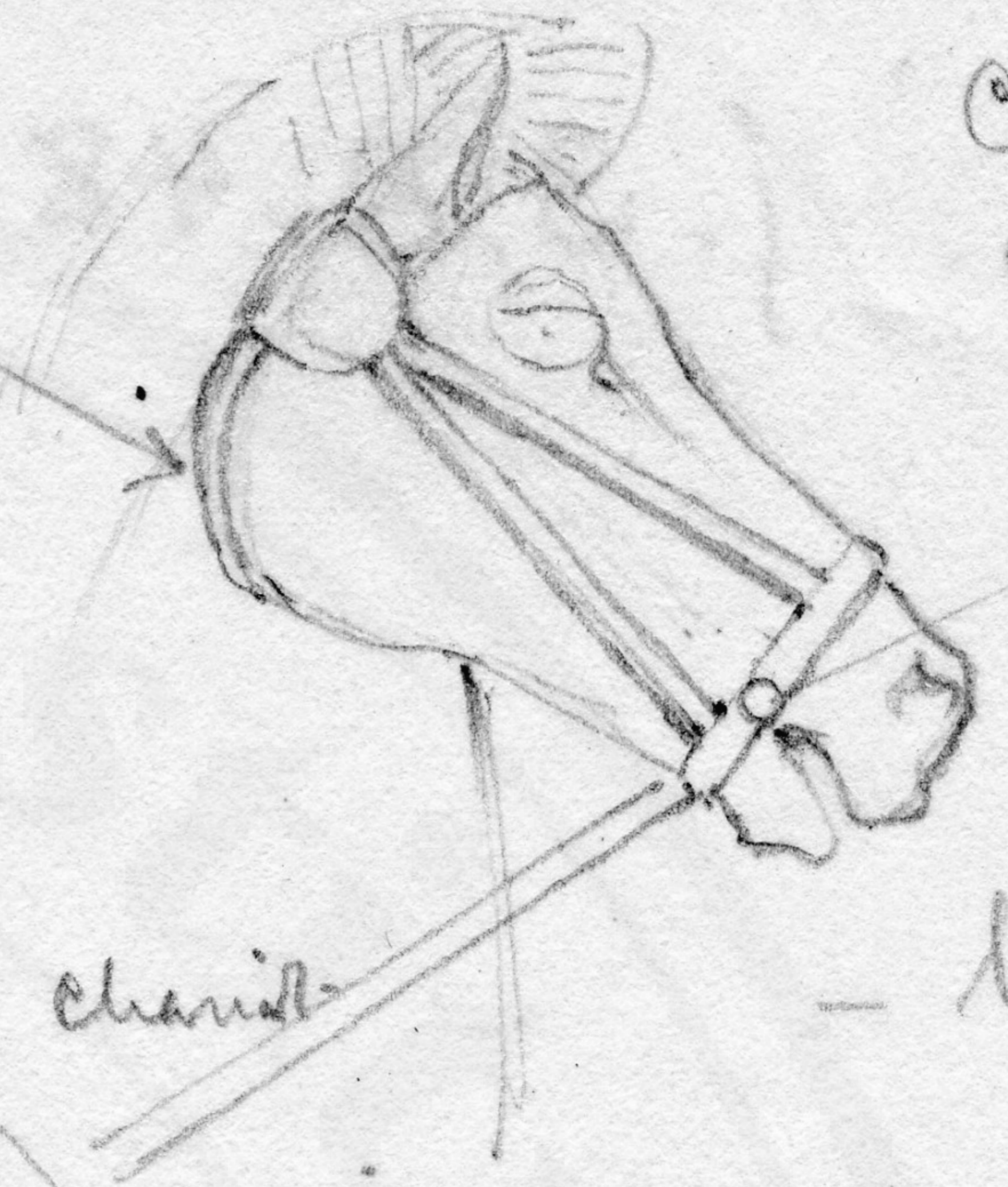

is passed.

breast-strap against which the horse works (in combination with the yoke).

(?) a munitah, or continuation of the saddle-pad.

The saddle, upon which the yoke works, takes the place of the harness upon the collar of the horse.

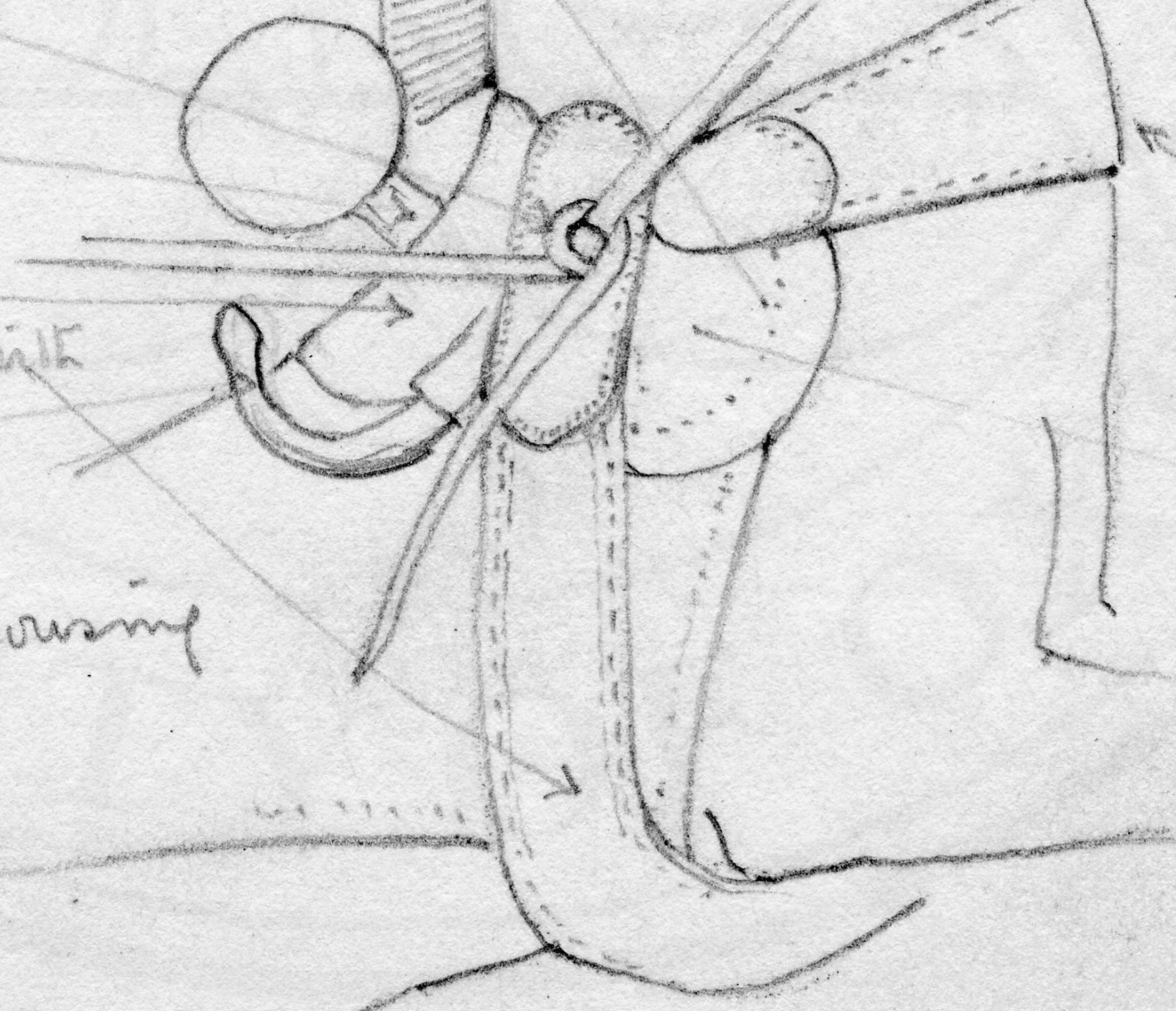

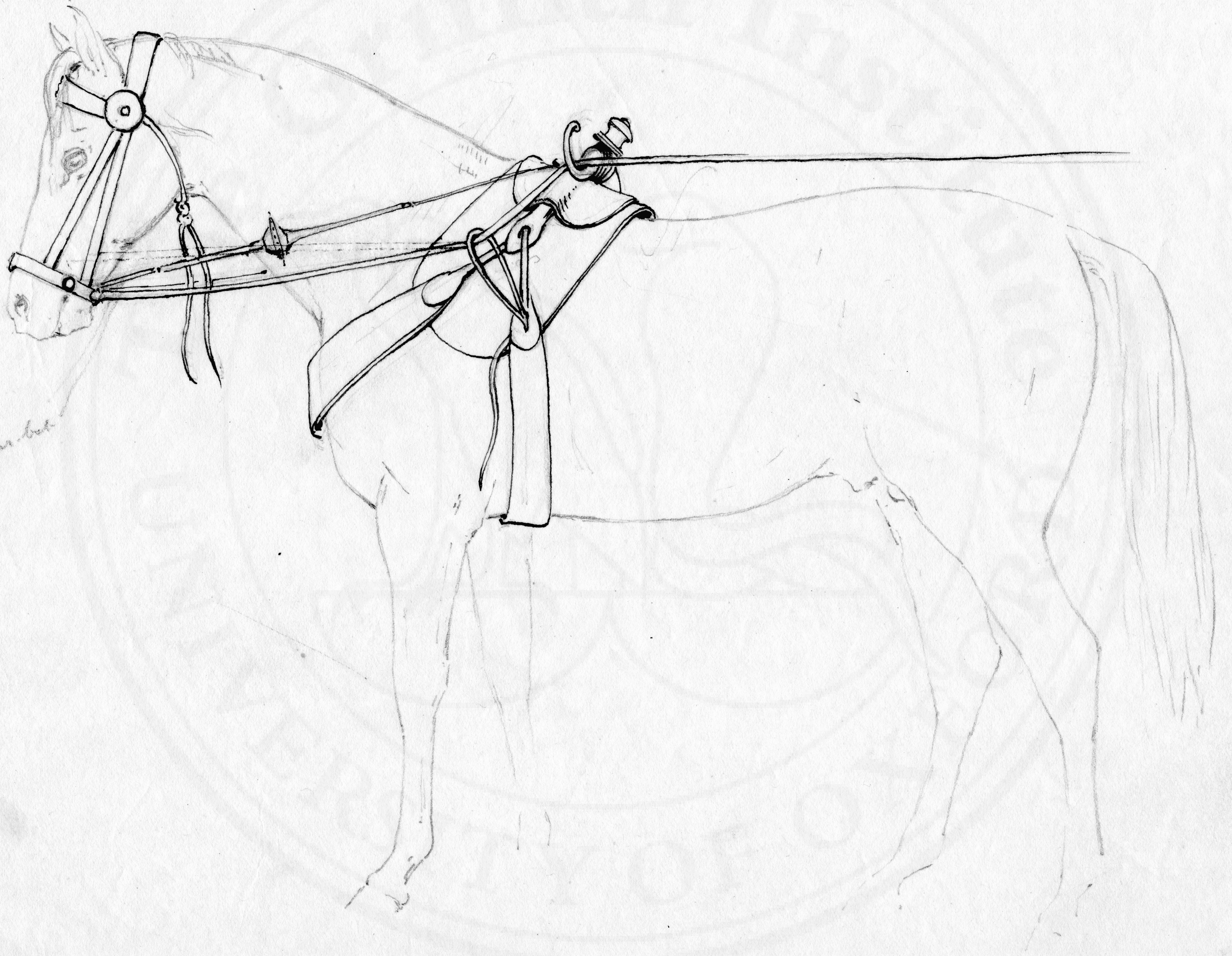


The principal parts of chariot harness

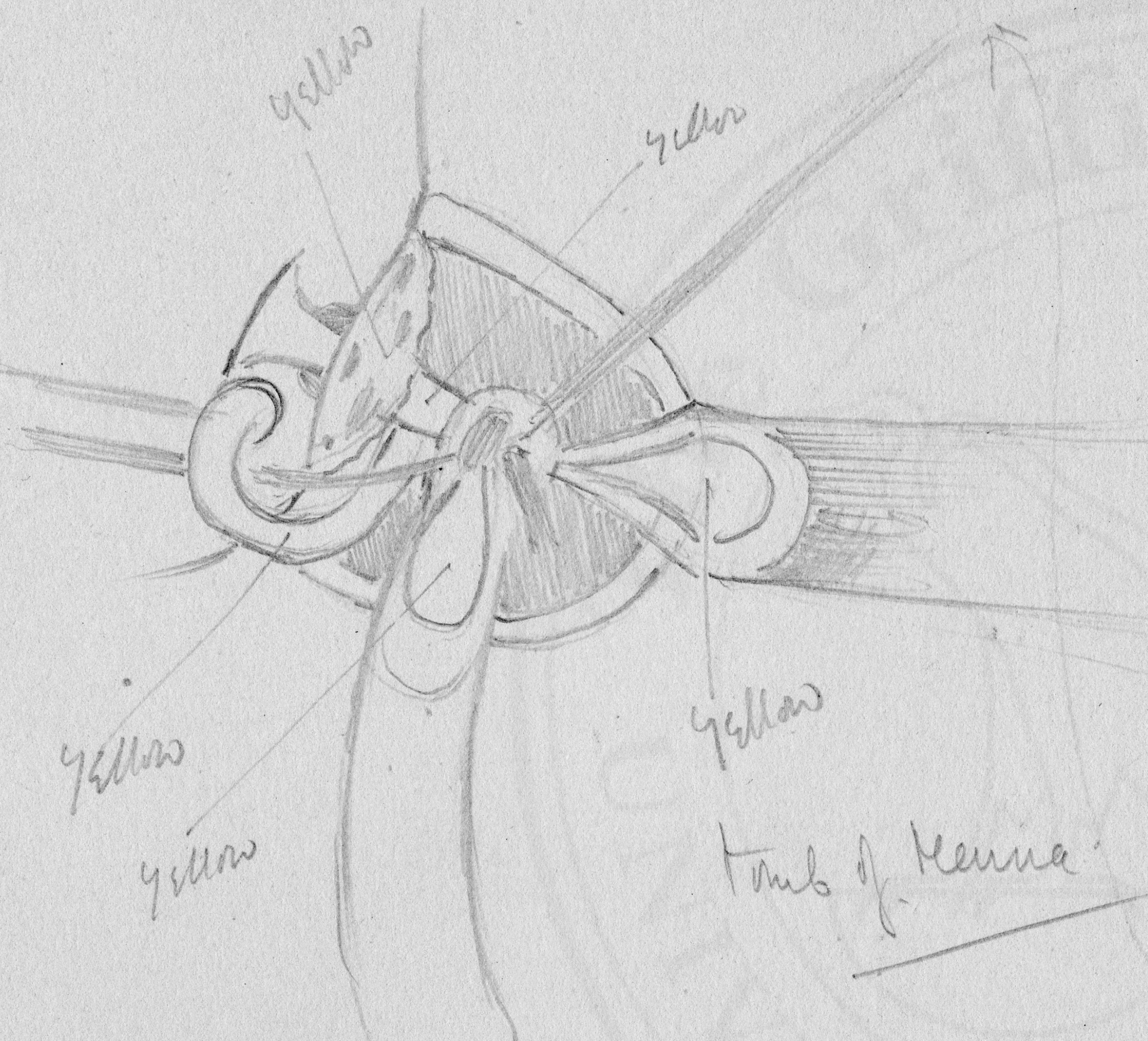

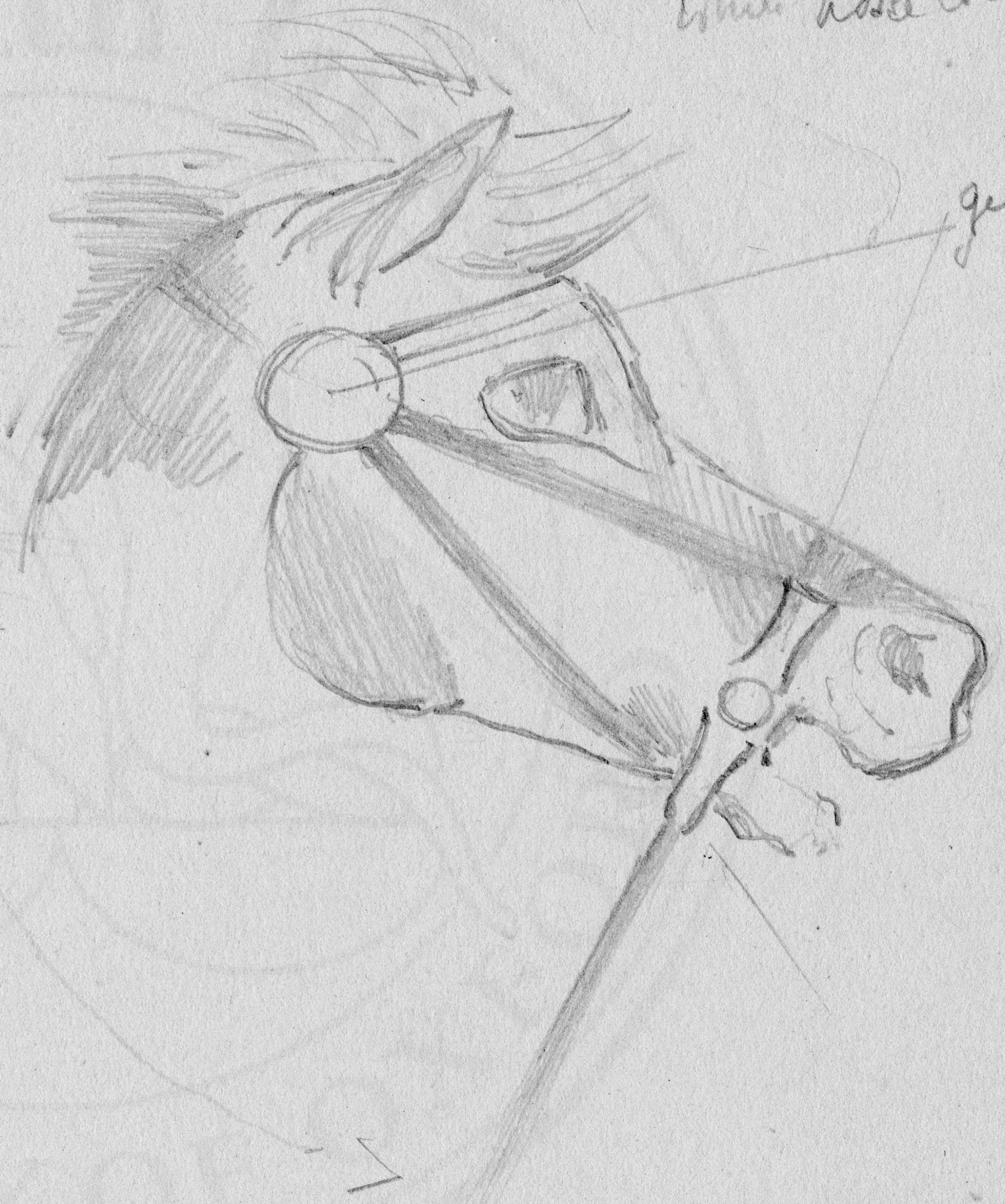

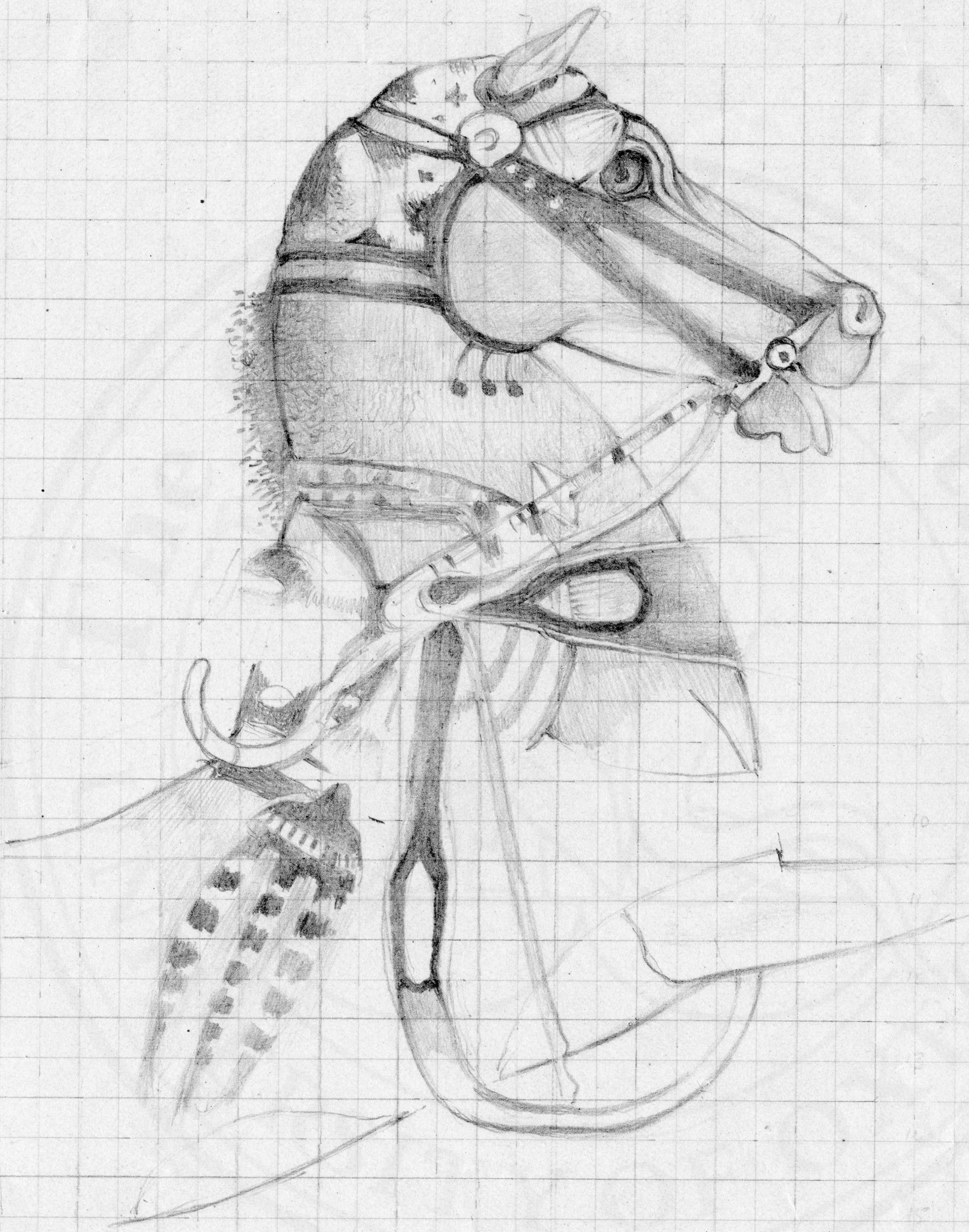
