Gresham House Oct 13th 1929 –

Dear Mother.

We are still in Cairo, complications having arisen over the cook. However we have the loan of one for 2/<4>months. so he is going to Abydos to-night with Miss C's nannie to prepare the house for us & we start to-morrow night.

I have been having a hectic social whirl yesterday The night before last we dine/<had> dinner with the Englebachs^{sic} {Engelbachs} & had great fun. yesterday morning Miss C introduced me to the manager of Barclays bank and I opened an account there, by the way I forgot to tell you that Cook's bank is no earthly use to me up country, they dont^{sic} keep accounts & I can only cash cheques in person. so I drew out as much ready money as I am likely to need until my first salary is paid into Barclays, when I can draw what I want by cheque through the post. 

In the evening we went with a party of friends to watch a game of pilote^{sic} {pelota} – it is most thrilling to watch & requires the utmost skill. I am running short of paper, my big block is in my trunk that has gone on to Baliana so I am using both sides to make these few sheets last out.

This place is very much nicer than Cecil House – it is also more expensive. 16/- a day

It is just possible that I might be able to get a good carpet here – a real old Bokkar or Persian. I believe Father was talking about having a strip rug for the passage upstairs if you would like me to look out for a suitable strip just get Father to measure it up. giving the greatest length & width & the smallest ditto. that would do & I will keep my eyes open for something suitable within the two limits. of course I dont^{sic} know if I could get one – but it would be a pity to let an opportunity pass. The Bedouin tent makers weave lovely patterns in their native dyed goats hair. they make beautiful rugs or divan covers. they are very strong but easy to roll up & shake. Miss C's old Nannie has a cousin who is a merchant, he is always on the look out for things when the caravans come in - we paid him a social call one day. & had a look at some of his stock.

I think I shall certainly buy myself a leather suit case, a size larger than the one M^r Gulstone gave me, so that I can put it inside it when I come
