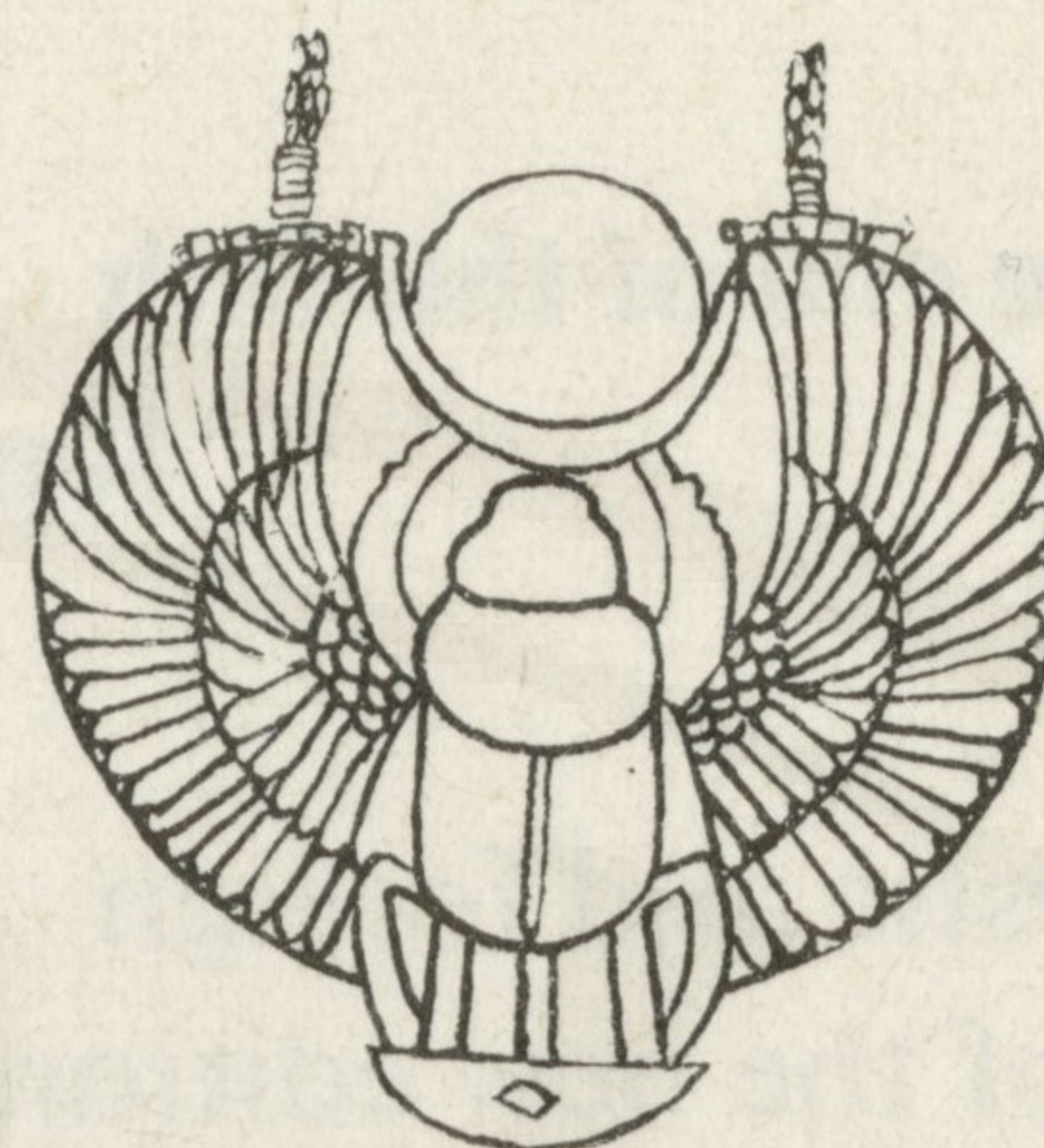

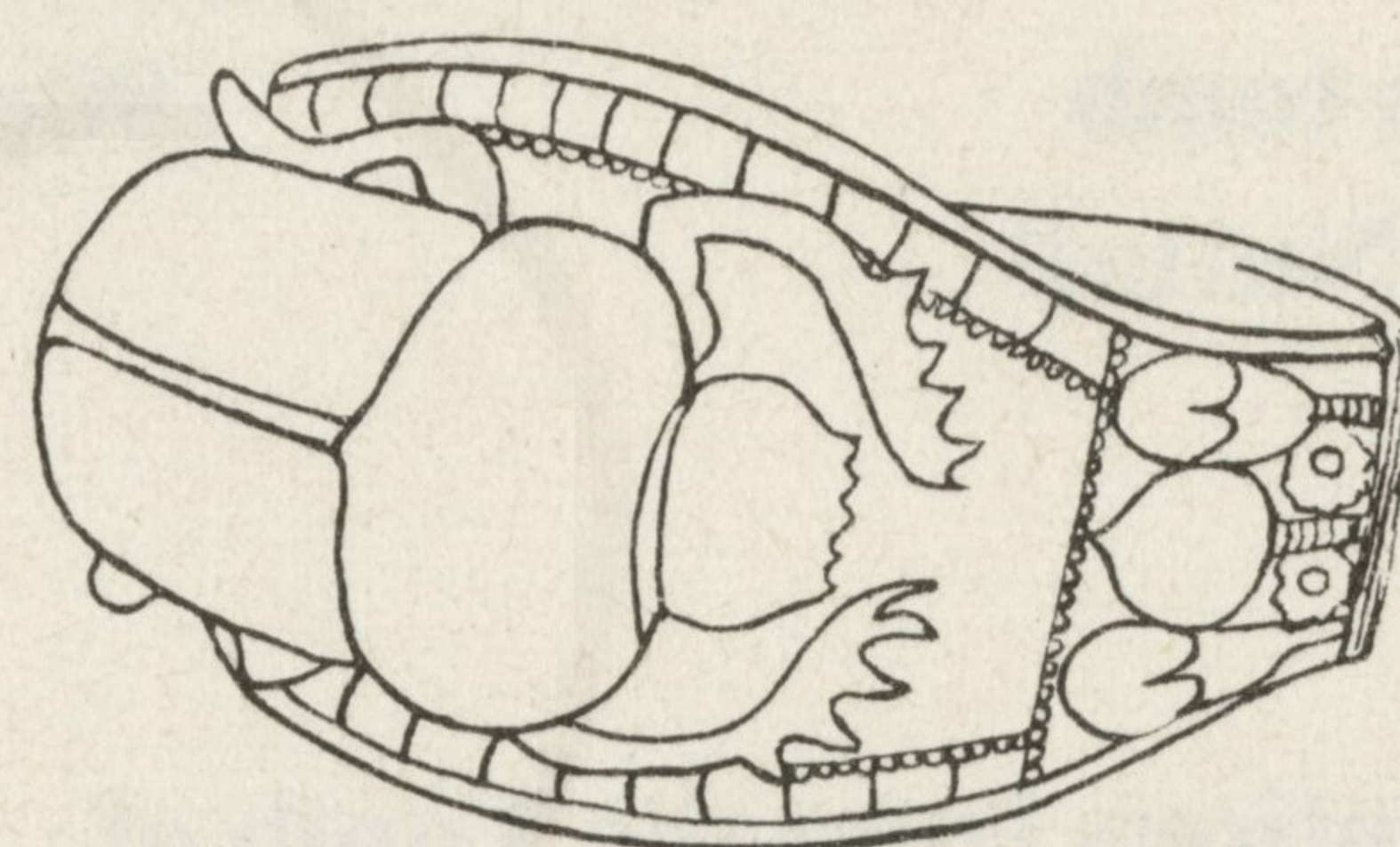

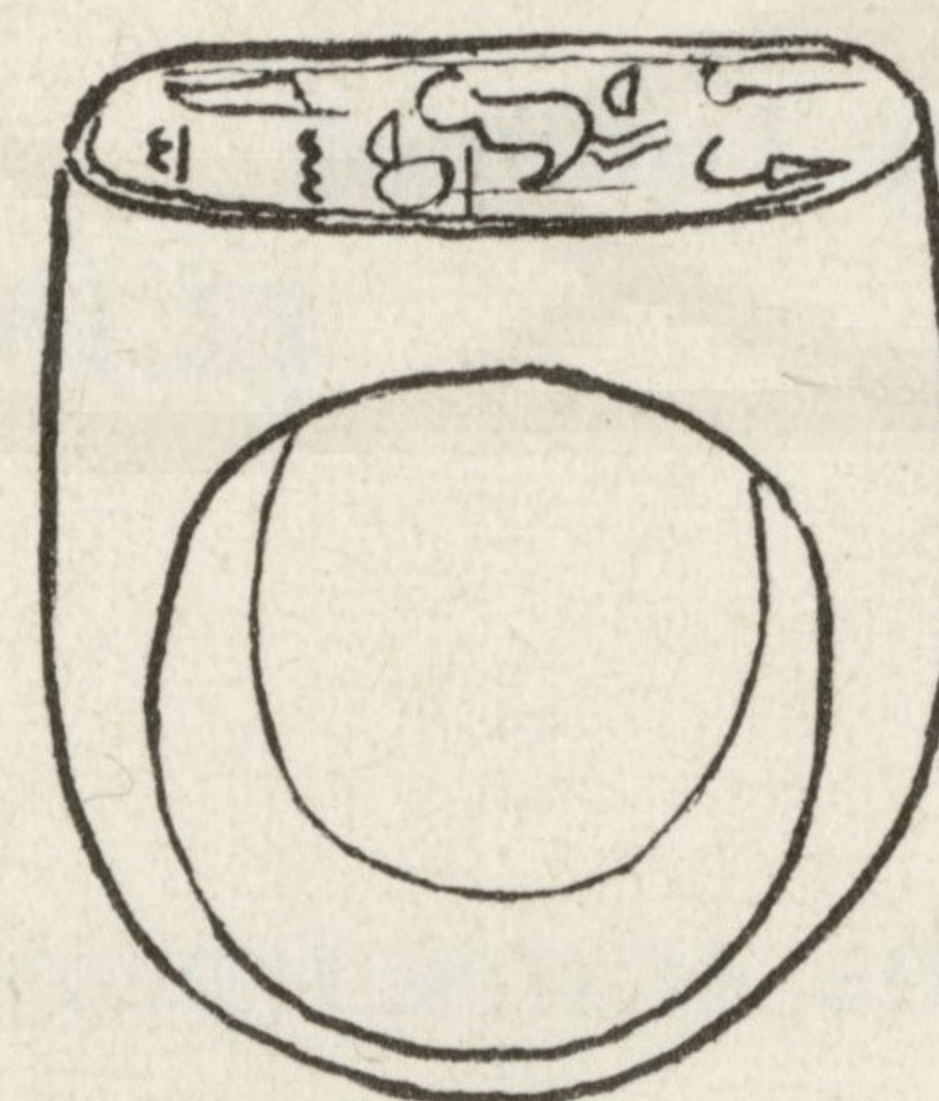
Winged Scarab Pendant £11.75

This is a copy of one of the pendants found on Tutankhamun's mummy. The original was solid gold inlaid with lapis lazuli and carnelian. The scarab, which is a symbol of rebirth, is holding a lunar disc and crescent. The pendant measures $4\frac{1}{4} \times 4\frac{1}{2}$ inches.



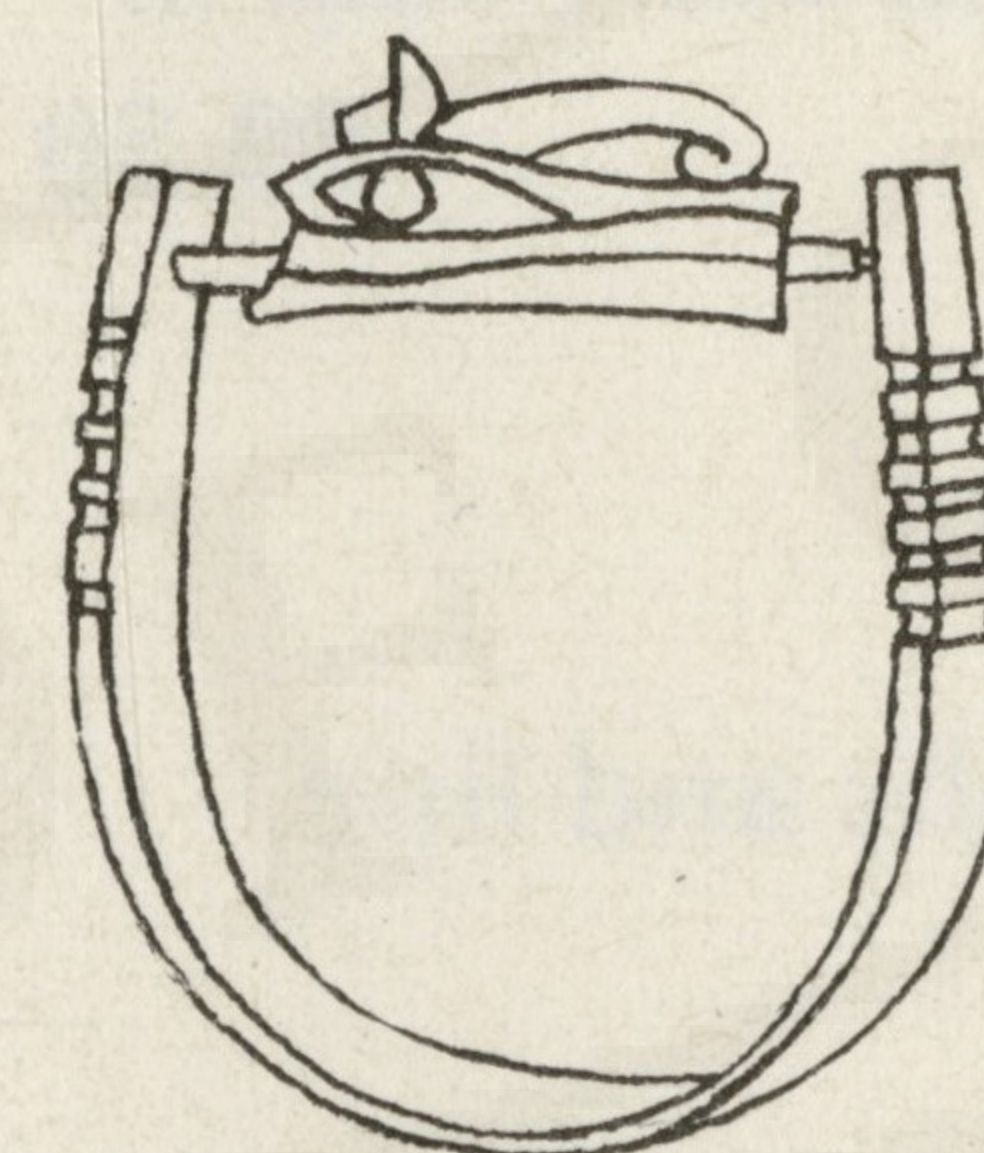
Scarab Bracelet £9.80

One of the most spectacular of the bracelets found in the tomb. A large blue scarab with gold belly and legs stands on the encircling gold band which is inlaid with many different semi-precious stones and coloured glass. It is small enough to suggest that it was worn by Tutankhamun at a quite early age.



Tutankhamun Signet Ring £1.75

The ring has Tutankhamun's official name, Neb-kheperu-re, engraved on the top.



Eye Swivel Ring £2.80

The top of the ring swivels round so that on one side there is an enameled 'Uadjet eye' which is a magical symbol of protection, and on the other side the 'Ankh', or sign of life.
